Phone Volunteers

Phone players to advise them of their sort out game schedule.

Last year we had approximately 12 volunteers for 30 sort out games.

Averaging 1 hour per team times 2 teams/game = 60 volunteer hours

Registration Desk

2 people/night Last year we had 9 nights @ 5 hours/night = 45 volunteer hours

Trainer Volunteers

To be on the benches for each sort out game.

2 trainers/game @ 1 hour games times 33 games = 66 volunteer hours

<u>Runner – Student Volunteer</u>

To collect water bottles and fill them, distribute pucks, collect pinney's, collect the evaluations after each game.

2 volunteers times 33 games and 3 goalie evaluations – 72 volunteer hours

Bench Coaches for games

4 coaches/game for 33 games = 132 volunteer hours

Evaluators

5-6 evaluators / night for 9 nights – (@ 5 hrs. per night) = 225 - 270 volunteer hours

Goalie Evaluations

2 on ice officials times 3 hours = 6 volunteer hours

6 on ice shooters (students) times 3 hours – 18 volunteer hours

4-5 coaches as evaluators in the stands – 12-15 volunteer hours

Directors

On top of being at the rink for these 9 nights of sort outs (45 volunteer hours), we also have endless e-mails to return every night during sort outs. We take the pinney's home and wash them so that they are fresh for the next night. Along with the hours spent reviewing the

evaluations to make up the teams in 3 different levels of Midget Hockey, we return endless phone calls, and try our best to match up personal requests while attempting to balance player strengths and weaknesses so that the competitive field is fair for all the teams.

Keep in mind that all these volunteers also have their own jobs, families, and other commitments outside hockey.
