

## Nepean Minor Hockey – 2020-2021 Registration Instructions

Hockey registration in the NMHA is available only to players who reside within the boundaries of the Nepean Minor Hockey Association. New players will be required to present a completed registration form and waiver, as well as proof of age and proof of residence before registering.

### Registration Requirements

All registrations must meet the following requirements **before** their registration for 2019-2020 will be accepted:

1. **Full payment** of all current and outstanding registration and team fees.
2. **Proof of residency for new players.** The HEO Minor web site has an address location tool, found at [maps.heominor.ca](http://maps.heominor.ca). If you are unsure or have questions concerning in which Association you should register, please contact the NMHA Office. Players moving into the NMHA area will be required to provide proof of residence before registering. Players wishing to transfer into Nepean, while living elsewhere, will be required to obtain NMHA approval before completing the HEO Minor transfer process.
3. **For U11 (Atom), U9 (Novice), and U7 (IP) Players** – Proof of completion of the Respect in Sport (Parent) course.
4. **Acknowledgement of the NMHA Code of Conduct and Privacy Policy.** Copies of the Code and Privacy Policy will be available at the Hockey Office or online at [www.nepeanhockey.on.ca](http://www.nepeanhockey.on.ca). The waiver form is also available at that site, in downloadable PDF format.

### Registration Deadlines:

**Returning Players:** Accepted online or at the NMHA Office, starting Jun1, 2020. Every returning player will be guaranteed a spot in next year's hockey program provided they register **before July 1, 2020**. Returning players registering on or after July 1, 2020 will be processed with new players. The online registration option will be closed in July, 2019, or earlier if divisions become full.

**New Players born on or before Dec. 31, 2016:** Accepted at the NMHA Office, on a first come, first serve basis starting on June 1, 2020 – 8:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon.

### Players trying out for Junior or AAA

Myers Automotive AAA hockey hopefuls must register with the NMHA to be eligible for AAA tryouts. Junior hockey hopefuls may register with the NMHA to ensure that they reserve registration in the NMHA, should they be released by a Junior team.

To guarantee registration, Junior or AAA hopefuls may register by paying a \$25 non-refundable deposit, rather than the full amount.

Players released back to Nepean from Junior or AAA must pay the remainder of their fees before attending any NMHA on-ice activities.

### Methods of Payment:

1. The NMHA Office accepts payments by credit card, debit card, cash, or money order. **Cheques will not be accepted.**
2. Online registration requires a credit card. Online registration allows the user to spread payments over three months, with an initial deposit of \$200 and then 3 equal payments on July 1, August 1, and September 1, charged automatically to the same card.

### Online Registration and Payment (Credit Card Only) (Returning or New Confirmed Players Only):

To register a player online, the Hockey Canada Registry requires that the guardian or player sign in to, or create, a user account on their system and then register the player using the name, hockey ID number and date of birth information contained on the personalized registration form.
